## BOARD CHARTER

## Introduction

The Manufacturing Alliance is a not-for-profit corporation established under the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) as a Company limited by guarantee. It is also registered as a Charity with the Australian Charities and Not-forprofits Commission (ACNC). Directors are bound by the Corporations Act, the ACNC Act and the Constitution.

## Purpose

This Charter outlines the M
role, authority, responsibilities, membership and operating guidelines of the Board and the interaction between the Board and Management. The Charter utilises the guidance of the following:

- Australian Institute of Company Directors Not-for-Profit Governance Principles
- Australian Charities Not-for-profits Governance Standards
- Department of Employment and Workplace Relations (DEWR) Jobs and Skills Councils Code of Conduct (Code of Conduct).
- Jobs and Skills Councils Integrity Framework.
